For nearly a decade, Author Tiffany Young has been doing genealogical research on her ancestors who lived and died as enslaved people on the South Carolina plantations of John and Mary Bull as well as plantations on St. Simons Island and Butler Island, GA. She has also been focusing on the preservation of Gullah Geechee culture and folklore highlighting the special gifts of knowledge they provide.

Tiffany will be discussing aspects of the history of Butler Island including exciting new information on a cemetery she believes she has found.

Articles include the history of Glynn Academy, the evolution of the Gullah Geechee ring shout tradition, and the Jewish Temple Beth Tifilloh. He has even invented a red light LED "sea turtle safe" flashlight.

WHAT IS A LEAP YEAR?

A leap year occurs every four years to help synchronize the calendar year with the solar year, or the length of time it takes the earth to complete its orbit around the sun, which is about 365¼ days. WHY DO WE CALL IT LEAP YEAR? The term for inserting extra time in calendars is "intercalation," which doesn't exactly roll off the tongue. We use "leap year" because each date on the calendar jumps ahead two days of the week instead of one. WHO INVENTED LEAP YEAR? Roman general Julius Caesar introduced the first leap year over 2,000 years ago. But the Julian calendar had only one rule: any year evenly divisible by four would be a leap year.
